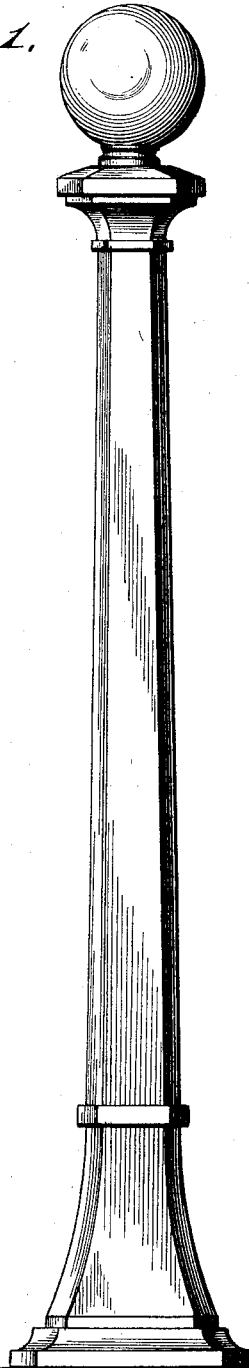
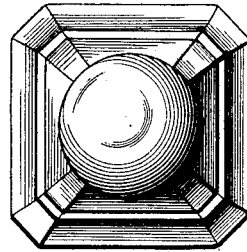

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWIN D. SMITH, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city of St. Louis and State of Missouri, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Lamp-Posts, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

The drawings illustrate a lamp post showing my new design, in which—

Figure 1 is a side elevation, and Fig. 2 is a plan view.
